# SPORTS RESULTS

## Cricket

### Girls U17A v Rugby School (A) Lost

In the T20 Cup game away against Rugby School, Sedbergh Girls U17 faced a challenging match. Rugby won the toss and elected to bat first, leveraging their experienced lineup. Openers Khan and Bishop set a solid foundation with an 84-run partnership before Sedbergh's Barker delivered the first breakthrough. Surenkumar and Bishop continued to build momentum, driving the score to 154. Barker struck again, showcasing her impressive form.

Chasing a daunting target of 167, Sedbergh's batting lineup faltered. Despite the collapse, Mycielska showed commendable resilience, fighting to keep Sedbergh in the game until the end. Barker's bowling was a standout, delivering an economical spell of 4 overs, 1 maiden, 2 wickets, and just 12 runs conceded.

Though the result was not in Sedbergh's favour, the team's focus and determination remain unshaken. Their perseverance and collective effort are truly inspiring, as they look ahead to future matches with renewed resolve and unity.

### Girls U14B v Netherfield CC (A) Lost

Sedbergh were second best by some distance against a good Netherfield club side. The batting highlight was Askew hitting an enormous 6 off the Netherfield captain's first ball. The greatest threat to a Netherfield victory was an enormous downpour during their innings but the Sedbergh girls showed great spirit and humour to crack on in the rain and complete the fixture. Despite the result this was, again, a great opportunity for girls who are just beginning their cricketing careers to play a competitive hard-ball fixture.

### Girls U15A v Repton (A) Lost by 7 wickets

Into the quarter finals and the girls faced a tough match against Repton. The Sedbergh girls were put into bat and looked to put a good score on the board. It was another run out that cost us, Tomlinson stranded after attempting a second run. Sedbergh we still looking favourites until Bellamy was dismissed hit wicket with only 33 required.
